

Active Targets for Gun Control Local Ordinances / Ballot Measures

These ordinances can appear as an agenda item for consideration by a local legislative body for their direct consideration (where we have 72 hours notice of such meeting / introductions,) or as a ‘hosted’ ballot initiative by that legislative body, or by direct ballot measure / signature gathering by gun control advocate groups.

Our first line of defense is reading all agendas as available

(Council, Zoning, Public Safety, Public Health, Youth Violence (as a disease approach)).

Be Watchful, Be Aware and immediately notify:

- FFLs in the jurisdiction and Gun Rights groups in the area and
- Fellow gun rights activists within that city or county area affected.

Almost as important is attending legislative body meetings and communicating with office holders directly (in small groups) to seek their positions of support or opposition to our rights. **Be Known**

Our Second Line of Defense is any gun rights friendly staff or office holders in the jurisdiction who can catch this earlier than noticed public meetings where it is nearly finalized. **Cultivate Relationships**

Finally we can pull public records of the active gun control groups communications with staff and office holders of that municipality, to identify those staff and office holders likely carrying this legislation

Know Your Office Holder’s History; Keep Track of the Proponents of Gun Control.
